



Communities for Families

Referral Guidelines

Communities for Families connects families who are isolated and overwhelmed with approved volunteer Host Homes who offer a safe, temporary place for children to stay, while a team of other volunteers come alongside parents to help address concerns that led to the hosting arrangement. Our goal is to offer support in a time of need and reunite children with their families in a stronger home environment. Participation in Communities for Families is voluntary and parents retain all of their legal rights.

Key Components

Communities for Families (CFF) is most successful under these conditions:

- All parties involved are committed to reunite the family as soon as possible
- Parent is capable of consenting to their child's participation
- Parent is willing to engage with CFF volunteers and work toward stability
- Parent/family is looking for supportive relationships

Parent should understand these key elements about our hosting arrangements:

- CFF participation is 100% voluntary
- Parent retains custody of their child and can have their child returned to them at any time
- CFF Host Homes and other volunteers are background checked and trained
- CFF Host Homes and other volunteers are not compensated for their service

Common Referral Situations

CFF Host Homes can host a child when a parent:

- Needs to be hospitalized (i.e., surgery or substance abuse rehabilitation)
- Has a mental health concern (i.e. depression)
- Feels overwhelmed or lacks social supports

CFF Host Homes cannot host a child when:

- There is evidence of current abuse (we will defer to Child Protective Services)
- There is domestic violence present and the abuser has legal custody of the children
- We are unable to obtain consent from a parent or guardian who has legal custody
- The child is exhibiting dangerous or violent behavior
- The child is in need of substance abuse rehabilitation

DC127 implements Communities for Families with the support of D.C.'s Child and Family Services Agency

Our volunteer Host Homes support overwhelmed and resource-limited parents by providing safe and temporary homes for their children, without threat of losing custody, to help avert potential abuse/neglect. Through the help of Communities for Families, less than 4% of the children served enter state custody.

Expectations

Parents should understand the following about CFF:

- We cannot guarantee availability of a Host Home
- We will assign the parent a volunteer Community Coach who will help coordinate the hostings and assist parent as they work towards stability
- We will try to place siblings together
- We will try to place the child close to home

CFF will expect the parent to:

- Set goals for themselves and work to address the issues that led to the arrangement
- Work with the Community Coach to identify their needs and solve problems
- Remain in contact with the child and visit regularly
- Participate in decision-making regarding their child's care

Our Intake Process

Parents will need to complete the following documents and consent agreements:

- Intake packet administered by staff
- Parental Permission for Participation in Communities for Families
- Authorization for Medical Consent for a Minor Dependent
- Liability Waiver
- Health Privacy Agreement

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
